The City Internship Program is now taking applications for summer semester 2005 (deadline: April 1st). This program allows UMKC students to work at City Hall on projects meaningful to their areas of study; gain a unique perspective on civic issues; and network for job opportunities, while serving the home city of their university. Selection is based on a combination of interview skills, grade point average, personal statements, references and skills. These volunteer positions range from 10-20 hours a week during the semester. Please note: All upper class, graduate, and professional school students are eligible to apply. Internship job descriptions encompass nearly all disciplines.

Students are encouraged to earn credit for their internship, after first consulting with their academic advisor or internship coordinator. Scholarships are available for a maximum of three hours’ class tuition.
