UMKC Faculty, Students and Staff:

September 17th has been designated by recently enacted federal legislation as Constitution/Citizenship Day, and institutions of higher education are required to offer instruction on the US Constitution to students either on that day, or the week before or week after if the 17th falls on a weekend, as it does this year. Here at UMKC, the Libraries have agreed to hold a "Constitution month" throughout September, thereby providing our students a month's worth of wonderful opportunities to learn more about the document which sets down the policies and procedures by which our nation is governed. Please visit either the Miller Nichols Library or the Law Library to learn more about our Constitution, and pick up a free, pocket-size copy of it. A link will be available soon at the Libraries' web page (<http://www.umkc.edu/lib/>) to on-line information on the Constitution. Please also look for flyers and posters on campus announcing these activities, and watch the UMKC home page for further details. More information on the Libraries' activities is listed below.

The Libraries intend to celebrate American freedoms as set out in the Constitution throughout the month of September 2005.

(1) The University Libraries will create a web accessible guide to information resources for the study of the Constitution at UMKC and the web, including sources at the Law Library and MSS materials from the Richard Bolling Collection on Civil Rights.

(2) The Law Library has secured pocket guides with the text of the Constitution which will be distributed at both sites.

- (3) The Miller Nichols Library will create two library exhibitions, the draft titles are: "*We the People...*" on the Bill of Rights and the Founders (MNL 2nd floor); and *A Celebration of America in Music* (MNL ground/Music/Media).
- (4) The Miller Nichols Library will have a book display with books that can be checked out celebrating the Freedom of Speech, by including titles that have been challenged in American libraries as "banned books," such as *To Kill a Mockingbird*.
- (5) For **9/11/05**, to celebrate American constitutional freedoms, a number of activities are planned. **The Miller Nichols Library will be staffed and open on 9/11/2005 (Sunday) from 1 pm (regular opening time) throughout the night until the regular opening hour of 7:30 am on 9/12/05.** MNL Daylong activities will include: (a) voter registration; (b) volunteers will introduce showings of films/videos on constitutional themes (ex. *12 Angry Men*); and (c) volunteers will offer on-hour performance readings alternating between the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution.
- (6) The Libraries sponsored KC voter registration training on 8/17 and welcomed campus volunteers. With sufficient volunteers voter registration will be offered in Miller Nichols library during the week from **9/11 to 9/16**.
