### General Information & Eligibility

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- Be between the ages of 25 and 50 at the time of application
- Be a newly admitted or continuing student (6-12 hours) at University of Missouri-Kansas City
- Have experienced at least a five-year break in education.
- Demonstrate financial need (students must complete and file a FAFSA at the University of Missouri-Kansas City)
- Illustrate potential for academic success by maintaining above a 2.75 GPA in all college course work.
- Show academic promise and commitment to obtaining their degree

### How to Apply

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- Review the scholarship eligibility requirements
- A complete application packet includes:
  - The completed scholarship application
  - A copy of your current resume
  - An essay describing why you believe you should receive this scholarship and how receiving the scholarship would affect your education and your life (one to two pages preferred)
  - A copy of all non-UMKC transcripts
  - 2 letters of recommendation

- Attendance required at the *Re-entry Scholar Welcome Event* and the *Donor Scholar Event*.
- Meet with Scholarship Director to review mid-term grades.
- Submit a *Thank You Letter* and *Scholarship Acceptance Form* to the College of Arts and Sciences Scholarship Office.
